## Fun Facts!

- Established in 1825, Fort Gratiot Light is the oldest operating lighthouse in the Great Lakes.
- The light was the first on Lake Huron.
- Originally the tower was 32 feet tall, but after two additions the tower reached its current height of 82 feet in 1861.
- The Grand Trunk Western Railroad Tunnel opened in 1891 and links Port Huron with Canada. It was the first international tunnel in the world.
- There are two area paper mills. Dunn Paper's mill at the mouth of the St. Clair River. Domtar also operates a paper mill located on the Black River.
- The Great Lakes Maritime Center offers the chance to see a freighter pass winthin 100 feet of glass windows.
