



WINDMILL POINT LIGHT

Fun Facts!

-  Windmill Point is located at the meeting point of Lake St. Clair and the Detroit River.
-  The light was built in 1837 and began operation in 1838.
-  The first keeper of the light, John Martin, also served as a representative for Michigan after it became a state in 1837.
-  The area was once known as Presque-Isle, French for almost an island, given the marshy land prone to flooding.
-  The original erection of a windmill on the site yielded the name Windmill Point.
-  In the 1920s, the Public Health Service constructed a Marine Hospital on the site, after a land swap with the Lighthouse Service.
