The original north pier light was built in 1884. The south pier light was originally built in 1914 and replaced with a steel structure in 1948.



The light remains an active navigation aid to this day.



The design is similar to the Alpena Light. It was originally painted red, and repainted to match in 2009.



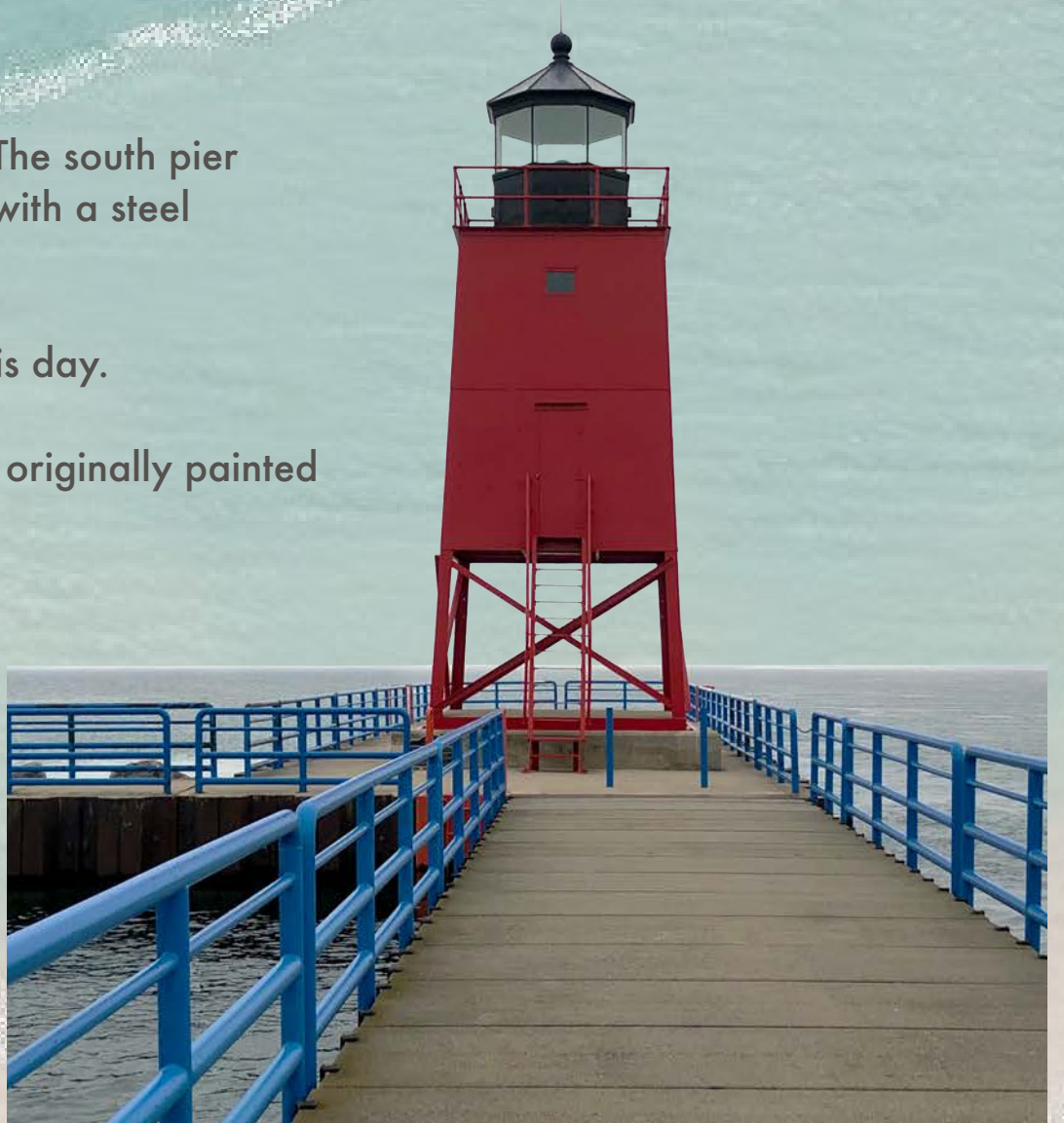
Charlevoix has been a popular resort destination since the late 19th century.
